Where can you study?

6th form Colleges

- Specialist colleges for 16-18 year olds.
- Mainly offer academic courses with a smaller number of vocational options.
- Offer a wide range of subjects.

Examples of 6th Form Colleges are:

School 6th forms

- Attached to a Secondary School.
- Can vary in size so the courses and subjects you can study will vary.
- Usually offer a smaller learning environment and have smaller class sizes.

FE Colleges

- Usually offer a wider range of both vocational and academic courses.
- Offer courses for all ages and ability levels.
- Offer both full time and part time courses.

Apprenticeships

- An apprenticeship is <u>paid</u> employment.
- Includes nationally recognised training.
- 80% work 20% study.
- Include: Catering,
 Childcare, Construction,
 Engineering, Finance,
 Hairdressing,
 Motor Vehicle, office work,
 etc.
- GCSEs at Grade 4 and above especially in English and Maths.
