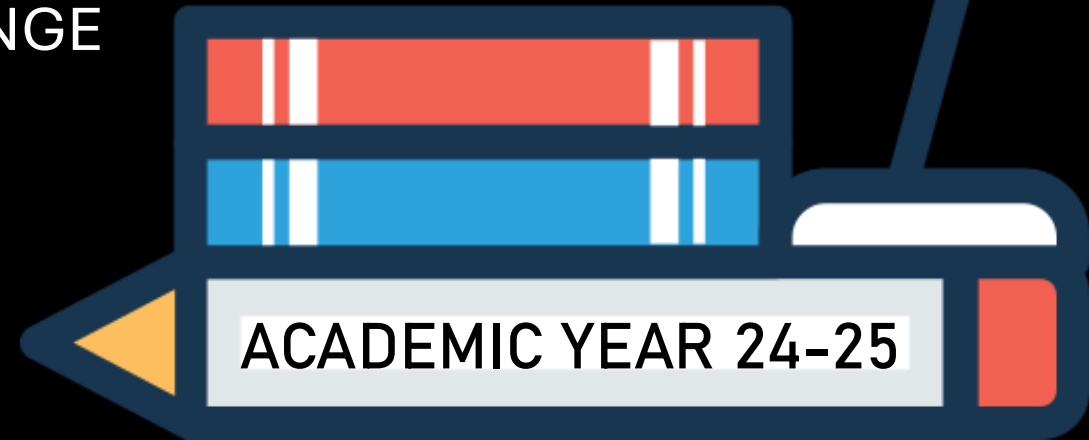

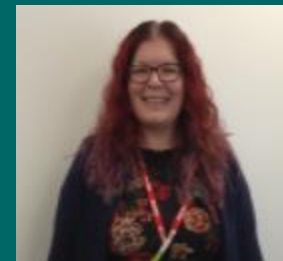

What is Remembrance?



What is Remembrance?

We remember people who have served and sacrificed for and alongside the UK, including armed forces, emergency services and all those affected.

This reminds us that whenever there is fighting, there is always a human cost, both for the people fighting and for the people living in countries involved.

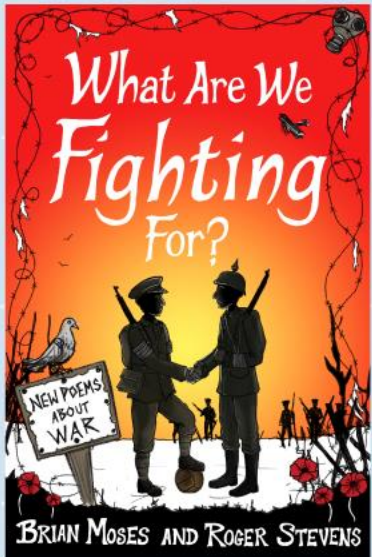

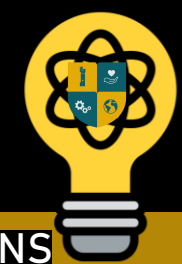
