



KEY PEOPLE



Here's some common questions to help your planning...

Can I choose my child's Form Tutor?

• No, although we will discuss with families should there be any specific need or concern. We also promote students meeting new people and friends.

Does my child get Lunch on Transition Day?

Yes – we will have them fed and watered at break and lunch.

How do I get my child's Uniform?

You will receive a voucher upon attendance at the Transition evening and completion of induction forms. This can be exchanged at Natasha's or Term Time Wear and will include a tie, a school blazer/jumper and a PE Kit. Plain black trousers/skirt, a white shirt and black shoes can then be purchased from a range of high street shops/supermarkets.

Can my child be in RISE?

• Only those students that have gone through our selection process and have certain SEND needs have access to RISE provision.

Can my child make their own way to school on Transition Day?

Yes.

What does my child wear on Transition Day?

They wear their current Primary School Uniform.

Do you use Parent Pay?
