### COMMUNITY MEMO: Return to ClassCharts ➤ 5TH MAY 2025

#### **Dear Families**

After a trial period of using our <u>Bromcom</u> system for <u>behaviour</u>, the decision has been made to return to ClassCharts.

As of Tuesday 6th May 2025 we will be using the ClassCharts system for recording all behaviours both positive and negative. This will mean that students and families will need to download the ClassCharts app in order to access any behaviour information.

Bromcom will still be fully in place for anything attendance based so please continue to use this app as well as using the ClassCharts app.





instructions.


Wait in silence to be dismissed. Your teacher will do this promptly if all other routines have been followed.

Walk on the left Not going over the white line to allow for flow of traffic.








