




New Students



ACADEMIC YEAR 2025 – KEY CELEBRATION HEADLINES FOR OUR COMMUNITY

Newsome Academy is pleased to report another RECORD-BREAKING YEAR with some fantastic achievements by our amazing students in their GCSEs and other qualifications this summer. This year, we achieved our highest ever number of students reaching grade 5 and above – an 8% increase on last year.

We usually publish individuals but not all have opened their results and are waiting to celebrate with their families so I will publish this in another statement when we return.

- There were 119 grade 7's and above achieved this year with some breath-taking highest achievers of all time in our history.
- There were a total of 17 grade 9's, 39 grade 8's and 63 grade 7's achieved.

Here are some highlights from this year- as not all students may have collected their results or shared them with others yet, we have generalised some of the special mentions below:


- 14 students achieved multiple Grade 9s with one student achieving a total of 8 grade 9s across all subjects, reflecting exceptional academic performance and consistent excellence across a range of subjects.
- The **Health and Fitness programme** has been a great success, with *7 students achieving a Distinction (star)** a fantastic result that reflects dedication both in practical and written elements of the course.
- This year, an outstanding 8 Grade 9s were achieved across a range of languages, reflecting exceptional skill, dedication, and cultural understanding.

Additionally, our post 16 alumni have also excelled, with students going on to achieve top A level results and progressing to prestigious universities including King's College London and Queen's University Belfast. Our students go on and succeed!

Overall, students have demonstrated resilience and maturity, and this has been personally heartwarming to watch as Headteacher. Another needed mention is the tremendous support and care that our families offer their child - having worked in 5 secondary schools, Newsome families stand out by far and I congratulate you on the effort and lengths taken to ensure the right support and challenge that you have offered your child through the exam season. It is only by working together that we can make the biggest and most positive difference in our children's lives, and we certainly have that within our community.

A special mention also needs to go out to our dedicated staff - teaching and non-teaching. I have witnessed relentless time, passion and dedication by them to ensure your child has had every opportunity to prepare for their exams. Whether it be in the classroom, pastorally or the administration offices, they have worked tirelessly to ensure students are all able to progress onto further education and study, and we look forward to seeing what they will achieve in the future.

2.2 Guidelines

2.2.1 Students

- Students remain responsible for all of their personal belongings whilst at school. When students enter the school grounds the school takes no responsibility for mobile phones. Mobile phones are brought to school entirely at the owner's risk. The school accepts no responsibility for replacing lost, stolen or damaged mobile phones.
- Students must adhere to the guidelines and protocol set out by the school when using their devices. If this is not adhered to a suitable sanction will be put in place. For safeguarding reasons, students are not allowed to use camera phones to take images on the school grounds.
- Mobile phones and other electronic devices are only to be used when instructed by a member of staff and to complete work/research tasks in an allocated period of time. The school are mindful that this must be kept to a minimum and only used when absolutely necessary.

2.2.2 Parents


- For safeguarding reasons parents are advised not to use camera phones to take images on the school grounds.
- Parents should not place images of other children taken at school on social media sites without permission from the parents involved.
- Parents are reminded that in cases of emergency the school office remains a vital and appropriate point of contact and can ensure your child is reached quickly and assisted in any appropriate way.

2.3 Acceptable Uses

- Mobile phones should be switched off and out of sight in school (Hear it, see it, lose it).
- Parents/carers are requested that in cases of emergency they contact the school reception so we are aware of any potential issue and may make the necessary arrangements.
- While on school premises, mobile phones are not to be seen or used by students, unless instructed by an adult.


2.4 Unacceptable Uses

- Unless express permission is granted, mobile phones should not be used to make calls, send SMS messages, surf the internet, take photos or use any other application during the school day or while on school premises.
- The Bluetooth function of a mobile phone must be switched off at all times and not be used to send images or files to other mobile phones.

- ✓ If there is any confusion, the school will assess whether it affects learning and will confiscate if it is 'unhealthy for learning'







Mobile Phones











