# Parliament week

## WHAT IS UK PARLIAMENT?

UK Parliament makes laws and debates big issues. It checks and challenges the work of government. Members of Parliament (MPs) are your elected representatives and make sure your voice is heard. The work of UK Parliament plays an important role in daily life for everyone around the country.

UK Parliament has three parts:

1. **The House of Commons** – 650 MPs who are elected to represent their local area, called a constituency.
2. **The House of Lords** – around 800 members appointed for their knowledge and experience.
3. **The monarchy** – the king or queen has a mostly ceremonial role today. They attend the State Opening of Parliament and agree new laws by Royal Assent.





## WHAT DOES UK PARLIAMENT DO?

The work of UK Parliament covers three main areas:

**1. Making or shaping laws** – the government can't introduce or change laws without UK Parliament's agreement. The government can't raise new taxes without UK Parliament's agreement either.

**2. Checking and challenging the work of government**  
Both Houses challenge each other through debates, parliamentary questions and committee inquiries.

**3. Representing people's interests** – Members in both Houses make sure the government considers the public's views on issues affecting them.

In order to do its job properly and make sure everyone's views are represented, UK Parliament needs the public to participate too – people like you, your family and friends. It's in your interests to take part, by contacting your MP, starting or signing petitions, or contributing to committee inquiries about issues affecting your daily life or topics you are passionate about.

This helps inform the decisions made in UK Parliament and lets Members know what your priorities and concerns are so they can take action.



## WHAT IS A LAW?

Laws are rules that everyone in the country must follow to keep things fair and safe for us all. If someone breaks the law, they may have to go to court and pay a fine or even go to prison. The laws made in UK Parliament affect every one of us in our daily lives. Members of Parliament have a very important job, making sure the laws passed in UK Parliament are fair and the best they can be. The process for making a law starts when a bill is introduced into either the House of Commons or the House of Lords. The bill is then examined by Members so that they agree on what it says. Once this is agreed, the bill gets approval from the Monarch (known as Royal Assent) and becomes an act. It is now officially a law! It can take a little while for a new law or change to an existing law to be achieved. The important thing is that proper checks and scrutiny happen so that the new law is the best it can be.

## DEBATING ISSUES

Debates are discussions in the Chambers where Members give their opinions on government policy, proposed new laws and topical issues of the day. They allow MPs to voice the concerns and interests of their constituents, and members of the Lords can speak about issues brought to their attention by the public. Debates help MPs and Lords to reach an informed decision on a subject. This decision is then often made by holding a vote for or against, called a 'division'



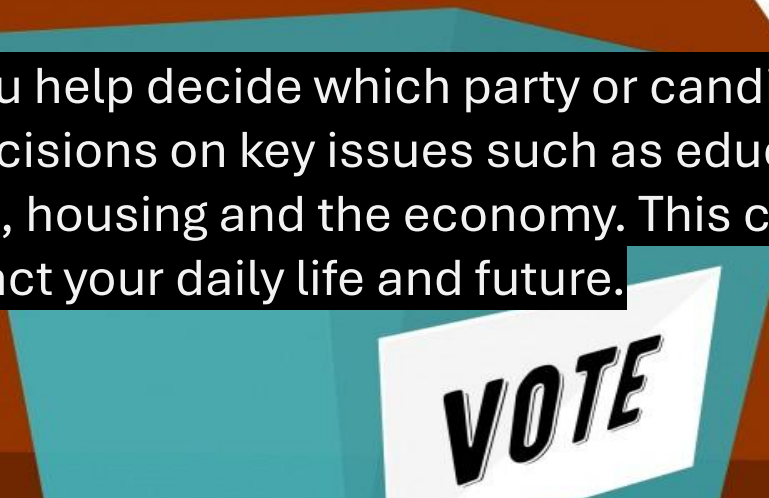


## **WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO USE YOUR VOTE?**

Voting is a fundamental part of democracy. By voting, you play an active role in shaping the society you live in. Every vote counts and can make a difference! Voting gives you a say in who represents you and how the country is run.

By voting, you help decide which party or candidate will make decisions on key issues such as education, employment, housing and the economy. This can directly impact your daily life and future.

Voting makes sure that diverse voices and perspectives are heard in UK Parliament and in government. It helps to create a more inclusive and representative system. It's a way to participate in your community and influence the direction of the country.





## VOTING FOR THE FIRST TIME?

If you haven't voted before, don't worry, it's really simple! Here's a quick run-down of what to expect.

- Before the election day you will be sent a poll card in the post. This tells you the day of the election and where you need to go.
- The Polling Station will be easy to find, as it will have a big Polling Station sign outside.
- A team of people will welcome you and ask for your name and address. You will need to show photo voter ID to vote at Polling Stations in some elections.
- You'll be given a ballot paper with the list of candidates you can choose to vote for. It will say which party they represent or if they are independent.
- Simply put a cross in the box next to your selected candidate and place your ballot paper in the ballot box. The team can point this out if needed.
- Done – you've had your say!

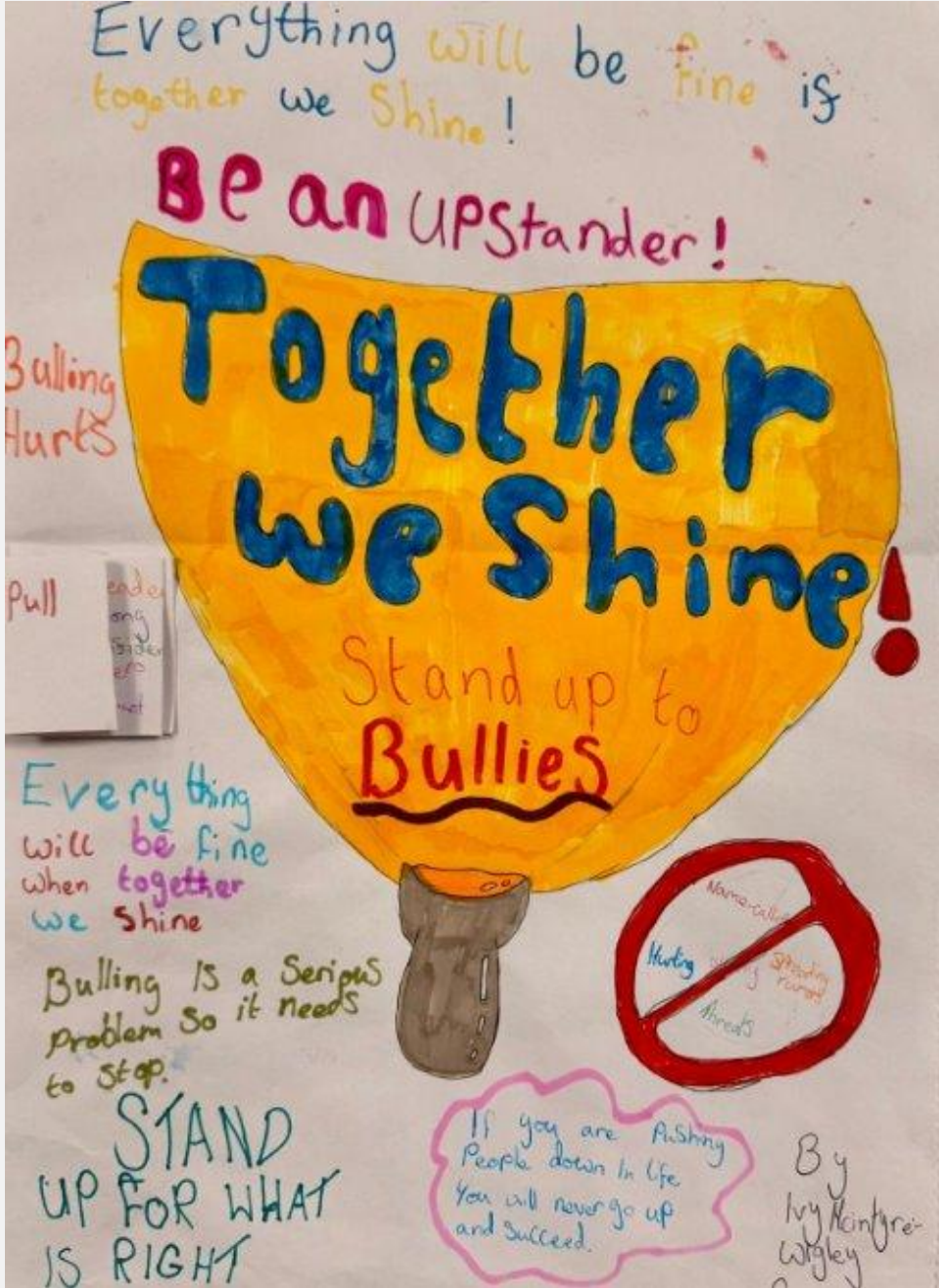

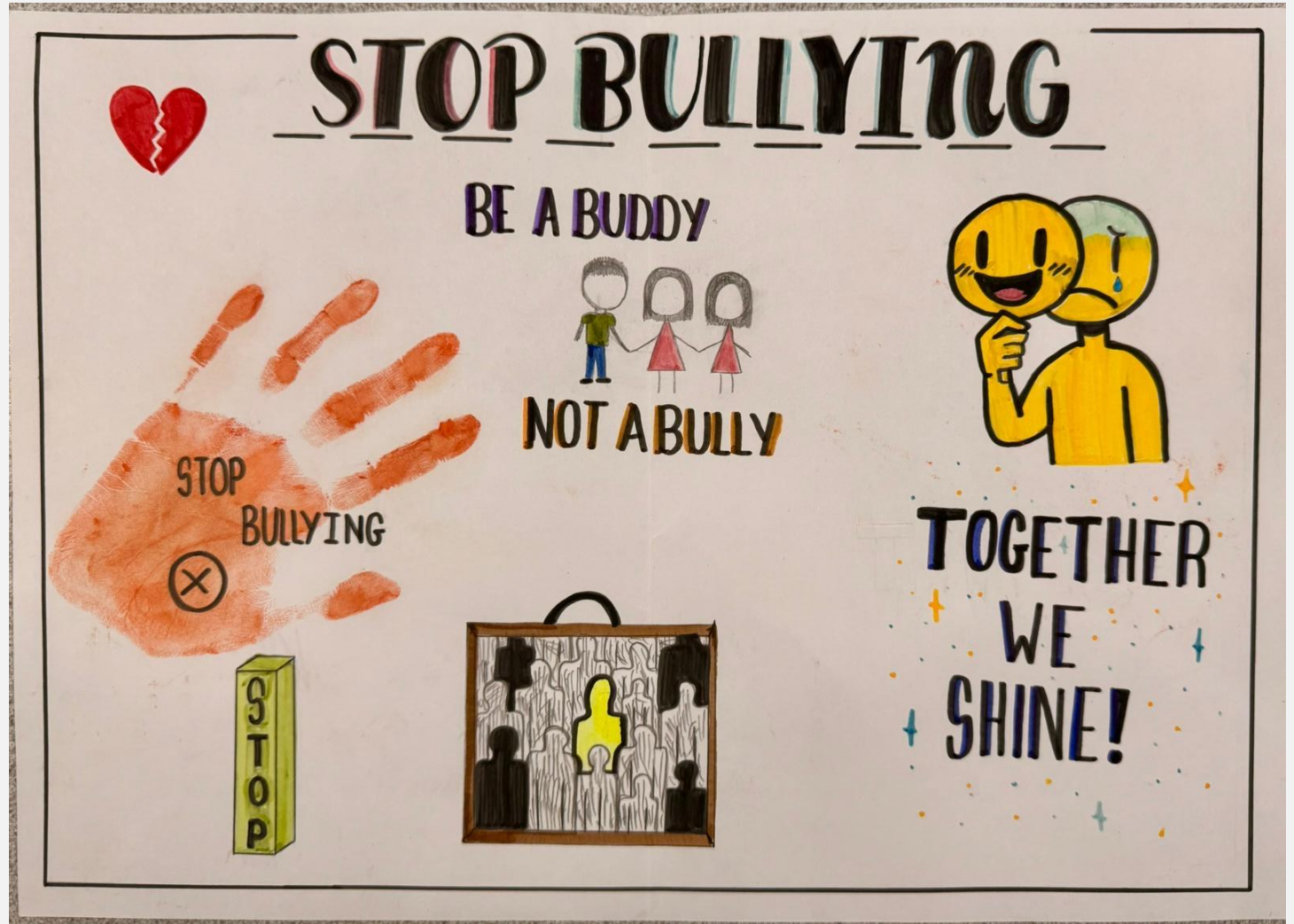
