















WEEKLY UPDATE

- Y11 MOCK EXAMS begin in the sports hall and gym for the next 2 weeks. Please familiarise yourself with the mock timetable.

















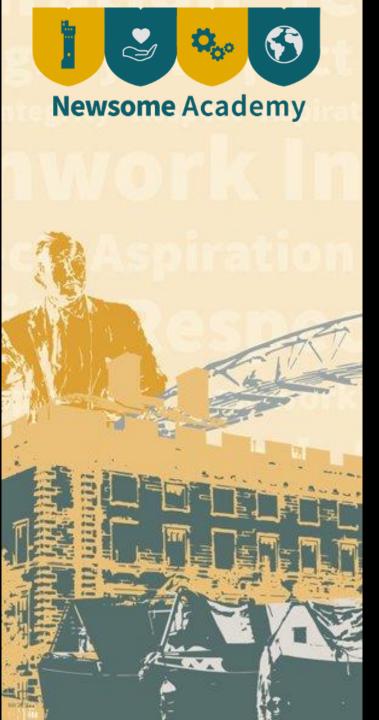






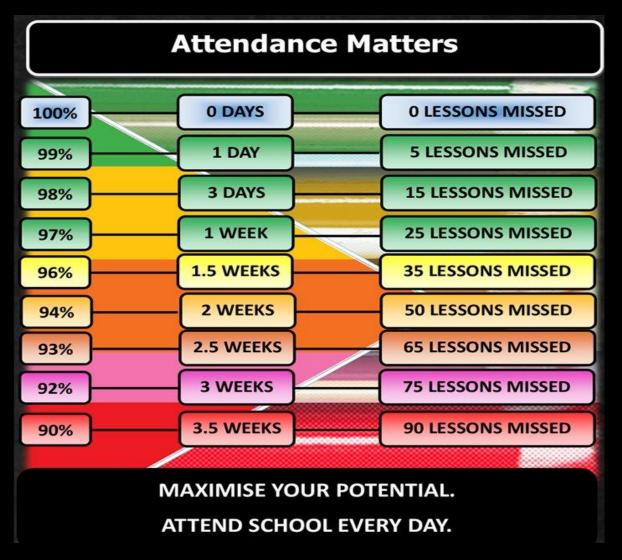

Green Careers Week is an annual event designed to help teachers, young people, parents and carers find out more about the wide range of careers that contribute to preserving or restoring the environment and our planet.

All information has been taken from the My Directions website, so check it out to see what else they promote and use it to log into your own 'my directions' portal (check your knowledge organiser for login details).



About the event

The UK has an ambition to become net zero by 2050. In West Yorkshire the target is to reach net zero by 2038. To achieve this, and to reduce the carbon emissions that are damaging our environment, we need to use cleaner energy sources like wind and solar power, drive cars that don't pollute as much, and plant more trees that can soak up some of the carbon emissions.

So, when you initially thought about a green job, you might have thought about one that involves working outdoors, in the environment, such as being an ecologist. However, there are lots of other jobs that involve doing some green work. For example, architects who design energy-efficient homes and motor mechanics who work on electric vehicles.

In fact, many of the jobs expected to grow in the transition to net zero, are those that are related to:

- •Energy supply and transmission including solar, wind and nuclear
- •Land use including non-livestock agriculture and food processing
- •Buildings construction and retrofit including jobs around energy efficiency and low carbon heating
- Hydrogen and carbon capture and storage
- •Electric vehicle and battery manufacturing





Why consider a green job?

- •Because the number of green jobs has been growing over the past few years. Employment in green jobs was an estimated 34.6% higher in 2023 than in 2015, with around 700,000 people now employed in green jobs in the UK.
- •It's predicted that even more green jobs will be created over the next few years. The Climate Change Committee estimates that between 135,000 and 725,000 new jobs could be created by 2030 in low carbon sectors, such as buildings retrofit, renewable energy generation and the manufacture of electric vehicles. An estimated 60,000 jobs could be created by 2050 from UK sustainable aviation fuel production.
- •Green jobs will be available locally. Estimates show that West Yorkshire has the potential to create over 70,000 new, high skilled jobs in the green economy by 2050, and 40,000 of them by 2030.

Routes into green jobs

Because there are so many different types of green jobs, there are lots of ways to get one. You could get qualifications that would help you get a green job at school, college, university, or by doing an apprenticeship.

At school, sixth form or college

There are qualifications including GCSEs, A levels, BTECs and T levels, in subjects that are related to green careers. These subjects include animal care, business, computer science, design and technology, engineering, English, geography, land-based studies, maths and science subjects.











Apprenticeships


If you prefer learning by doing a job, you could consider doing an apprenticeship. There are nearly sixty apprenticeships that are identified as being 'green' on the Skills England website. Examples include:

- •Bicycle mechanic (level 2)
- Countryside worker (level 2)
- •Nuclear operative (level 2)
- Digital device repair technician (level 3)
- •Furniture restorer (level 3)
- Low carbon heating technician (level 3)
- Arboriculturist (level 4)
- Associate project manager (level 4)
- Community energy specialist (level 4)
- Data analyst (level 4)
- •Improvement leader (level 6)
- •Soil scientist (level 7)

Entry requirements for apprenticeships vary. Usually, for level 2 apprenticeships, you may need some GCSEs and for level 3 apprenticeships, you may need four or five GCSEs at grades 9-4. For apprenticeships at levels 4-7, you usually need qualifications at level 3, such as A levels, a T level or a BTEC National Extended Diploma.

Green work experience

If you are interested in getting a green job in the future, it's a good idea to get some relevant experience and to develop your skills. Some ideas of how to do this include:

•Encouraging your school or college to reduce their carbon emissions. You could create an assembly about net zero, or help to set up a recycling scheme to reduce your school's or college's impact on climate change.

•Doing short free courses online such as through www.open.edu/openlearn/free-courses/full-catalogue

•Getting involved in environmental projects in your local community. This could include volunteering to clean up a local area or helping to plant more trees. Doing this will not only contribute towards net zero, it will also help develop your skills. You can find opportunities at:


