





Readiness for Exams

You can be disqualified from exam boards for malpractice, which includes actions like using unauthorized materials (e.g., mobile phones), copying work, plagiarism, collusion, or sharing/obtaining confidential exam information. Being late for an exam can also lead to work not being accepted. Consequences for malpractice range from losing marks to being disqualified from a specific paper or even an entire qualification.

Examples of Malpractice and Rule-Breaking

- Unauthorized Materials: Bringing mobile phones, smartwatches, or other electronic devices into the exam room is a common cause for penalties and disqualification.
- **Plagiarism and Copying:** Submitting work that is not your own, or allowing your work to be copied by others, can lead to penalties.
- Collusion: Helping other students with their work or allowing others to help you with yours.
- Cheating: Engaging in any unfair or dishonest practice during the exam.
- **Sharing Information:** Revealing details about exam questions before an exam, whether you think they are real or fake, or failing to report such information.
- Security Breaches: Breaches of exam security can also constitute malpractice.
- **Breach of Exam Conditions:** Failing to follow the rules for the exam, such as being on time.

Consequences of Malpractice


If you are suspected of malpractice, an investigation will be launched. Consequences vary and can include:

- •Losing marks: on a specific paper.
- •Being disqualified: from one or more exams.
- •Losing your entire qualification: or certification opportunity.

Definition:


Adjustments made for students who need extra support during assessments / exams so everyone has a fair chance to succeed.

- Long-term medical conditions








- To ensure fairness





Based on evidence:

•Educational psychologist or specialist teacher assessments

•History of need (e.g. long-term use in class)
Schools apply to exam boards on your behalf
Not automatic – there has to be a valid reason

Note: Teachers can help identify if you need support



Common Questions

Question	Answer				
Can I get access arrangements for every subject?	Yes, if you qualify for access arrangements you will have them in all subject exams (with the odd exception)				
Will other students know I have them?	Yes, but it is absolutely not something to be embarrassed about.				
Will it affect my grades?	It will only benefit them				
Can I use them in mocks too?	Yes, it has to be your normal way of working and so need to be used in all assessments if you qualify.				
I have a diagnosis of dyslexia, does that mean I get extra time?	No, it doesn't. It is extra evidence but school has to do their own testing.				
Does it mean I have special needs if I have access arrangements?	No. There are many high achieving students that have extra time.				
If I qualify for extra time, do I have to take it?	Yes, it is there to help you! Use it wisely.				


