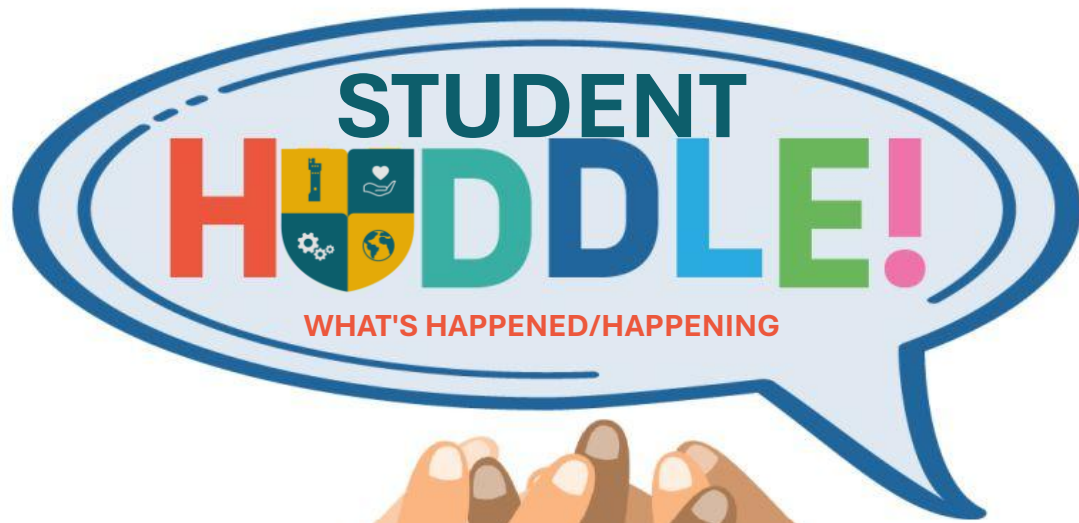

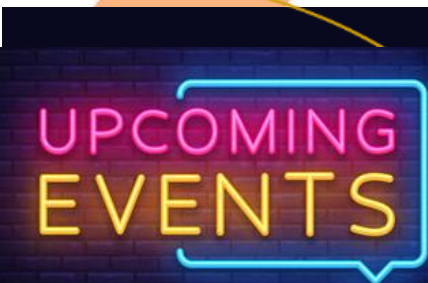

DID YOU KNOW?

- Velcro was inspired by burrs (plant seeds) sticking to clothes and animal fur.
- It was invented by George de Mestral in 1941 after a walk with his dog.
- The name “Velcro” comes from French words *velours* (velvet) and *crochet* (hook).



DID YOU KNOW?

- Coffee was discovered (legend says) by an Ethiopian goat herder named Kaldi who noticed his goats became energetic after eating certain berries.
- It was originally eaten as a food (mixed with fat) before becoming a drink.

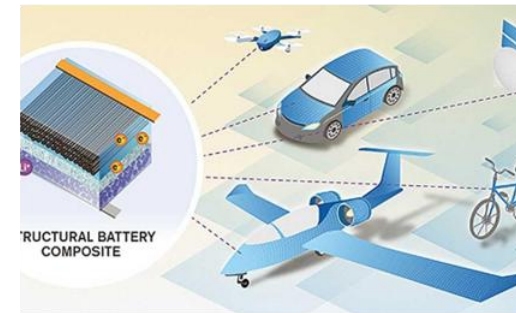

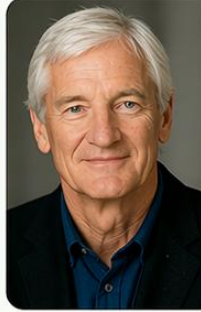

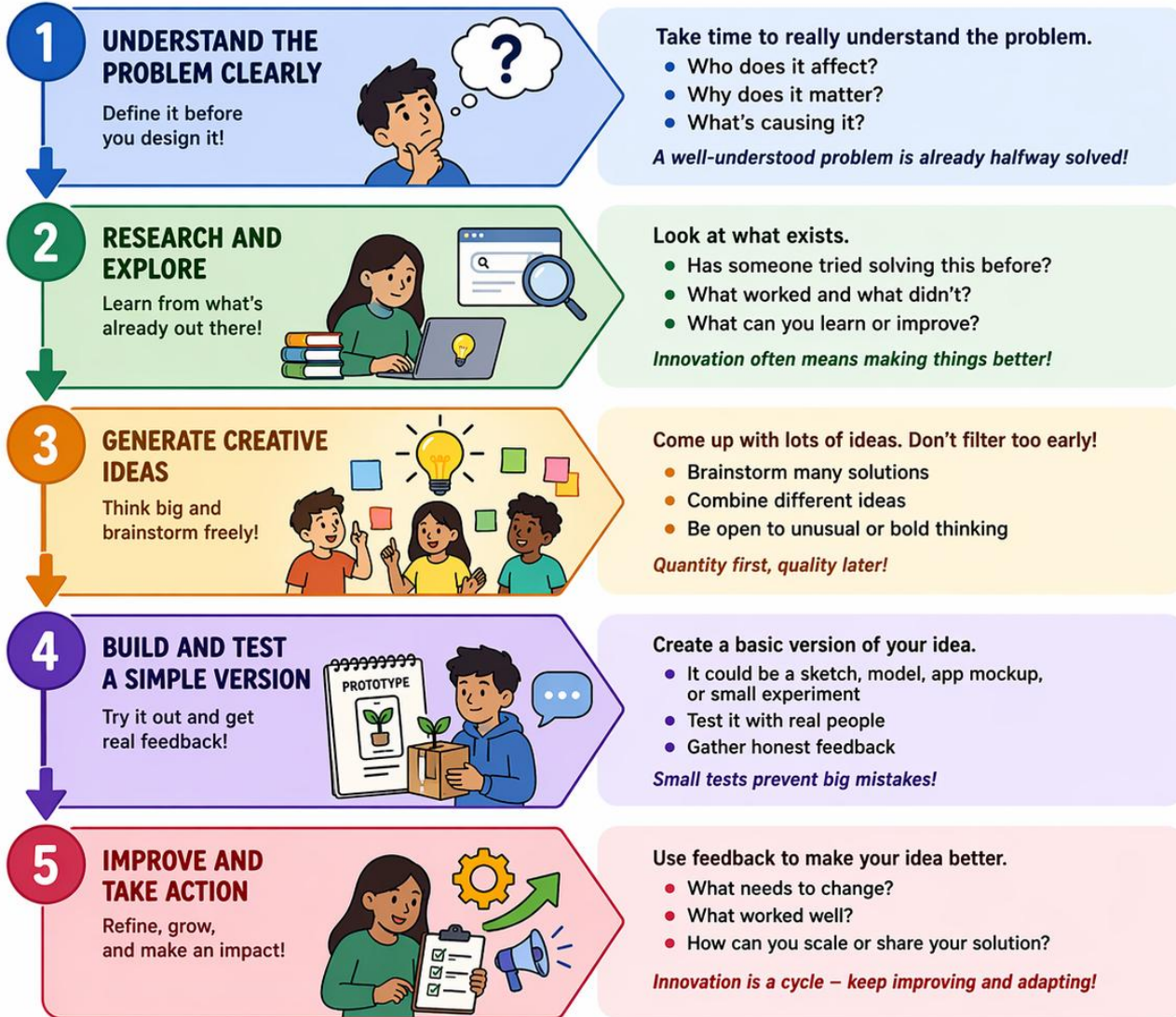

1. To be able to use creativity to be innovative, you need to **think** about the problem.

3. From here you can generate some different **creative ideas**. Some may seem a bit silly at first but this is your opportunity to think outside the box and choose which ideas have substance and the potential to work.
4. Finally, you **create** your solution and **test** it out. It probably won't work the first time without reviewing it, tweaking it and having another go!

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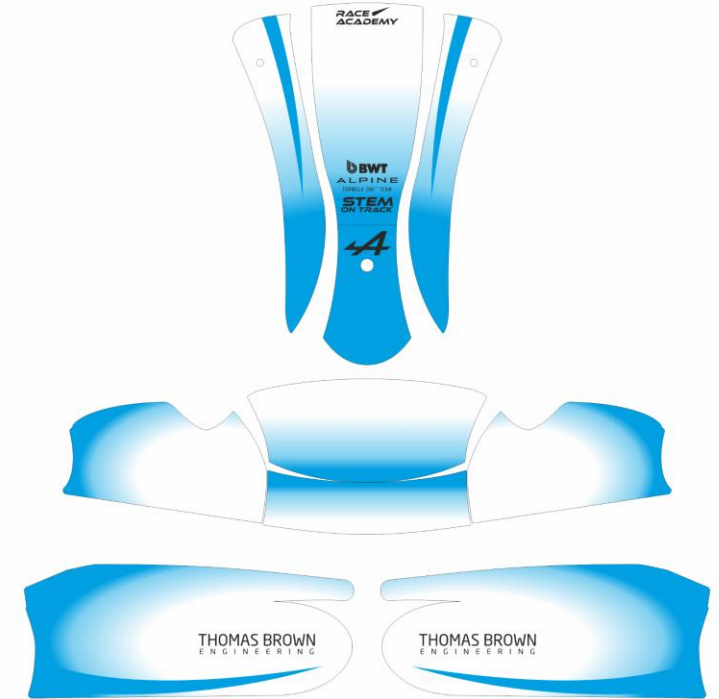

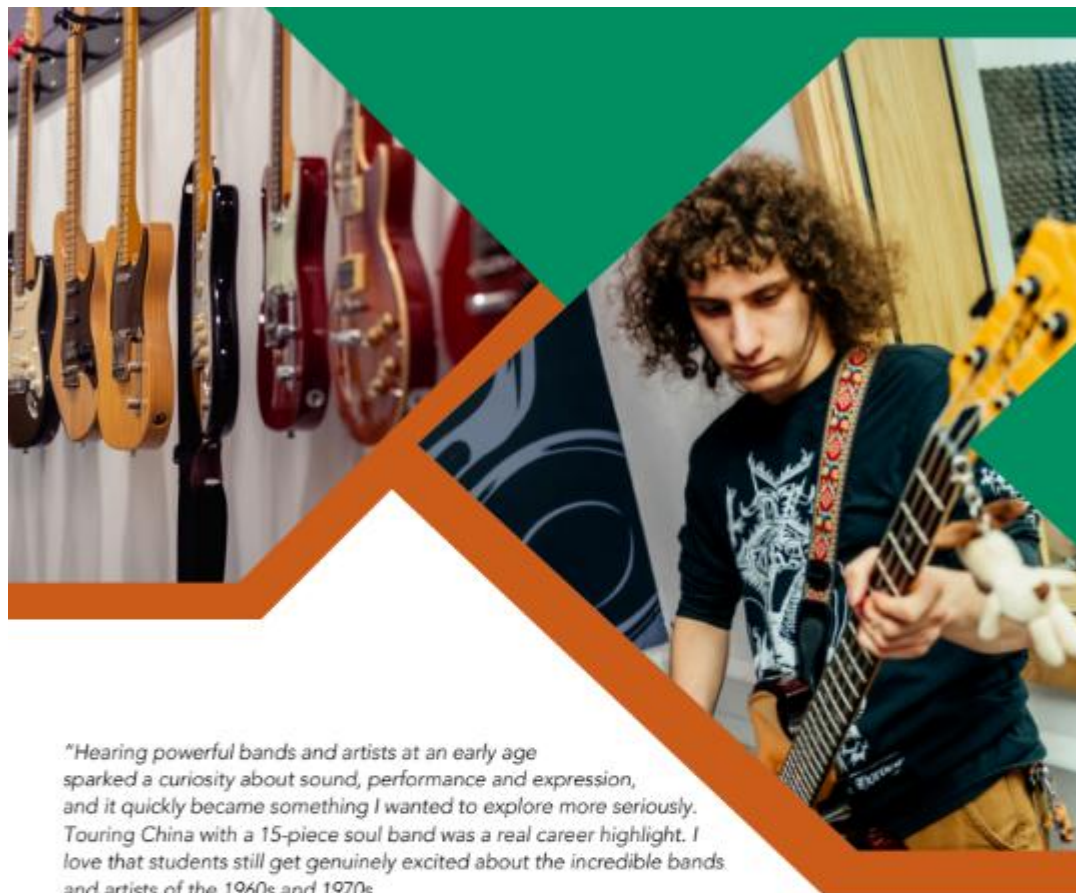
