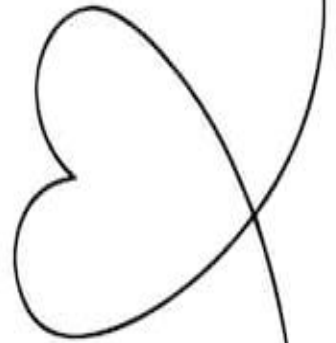

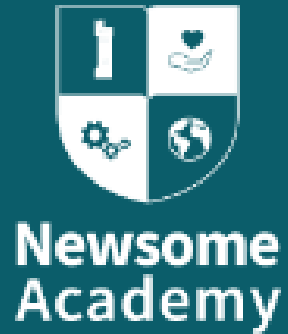

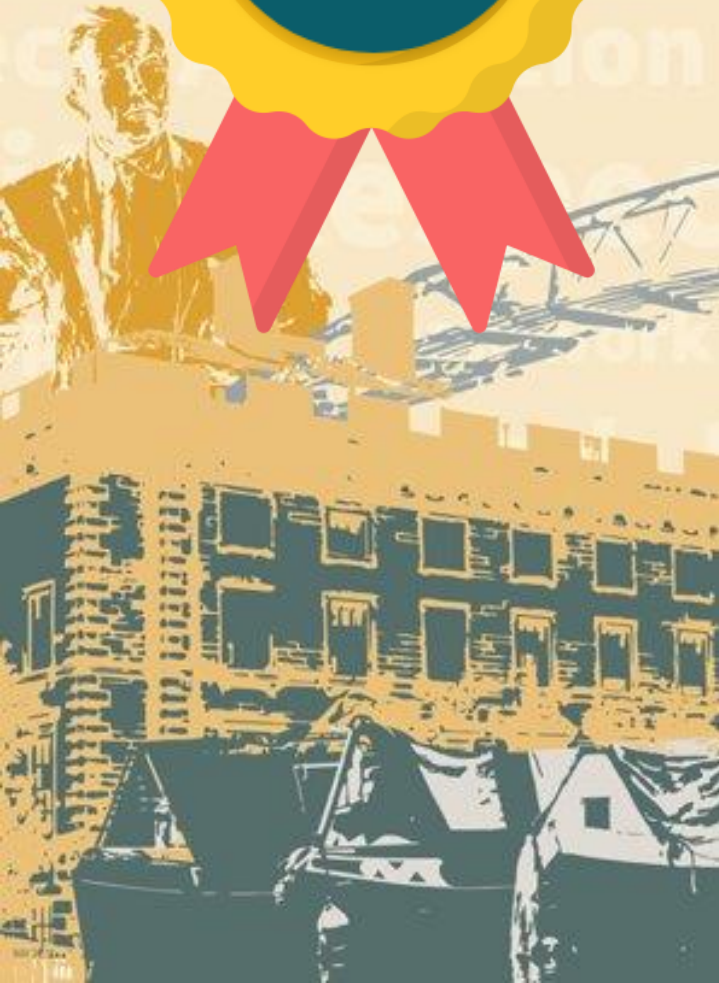

GCSE Contingency Day

Exam boards have agreed a contingency day as part of their standard planning for GCSE, AS and A-Level examinations. This day would only be used in the event of national or significant local disruption affecting exams across the United Kingdom. For the June 2026 exam series, the contingency day has been confirmed as **Wednesday 24 June 2026**. Parents and students should be aware of this date and ensure that students remain available until then, as any affected examinations may be rescheduled to this day. When making plans for the summer, including holidays or travel, Wednesday 24 June 2026 should therefore be treated as the final possible exam date



GCSE Results Day

Thursday 20th August

- Your child can collect their results from school on Thursday 20th August between 8.30am - 10.00am.
- If your child cannot collect their results in person, they can opt to receive their results via email or nominate someone to collect them on their behalf. They must provide the name of the nominated person by completing an online form which will be sent nearer the time.
- The representative must provide photographic I.D. Alternatively, you can provide a stamped self addressed envelope for results to be sent in the post. Again, this must be provided before the end of the summer term.
- **Results will not be released to anyone other than the student without prior written permission from the student as outlined above.**
