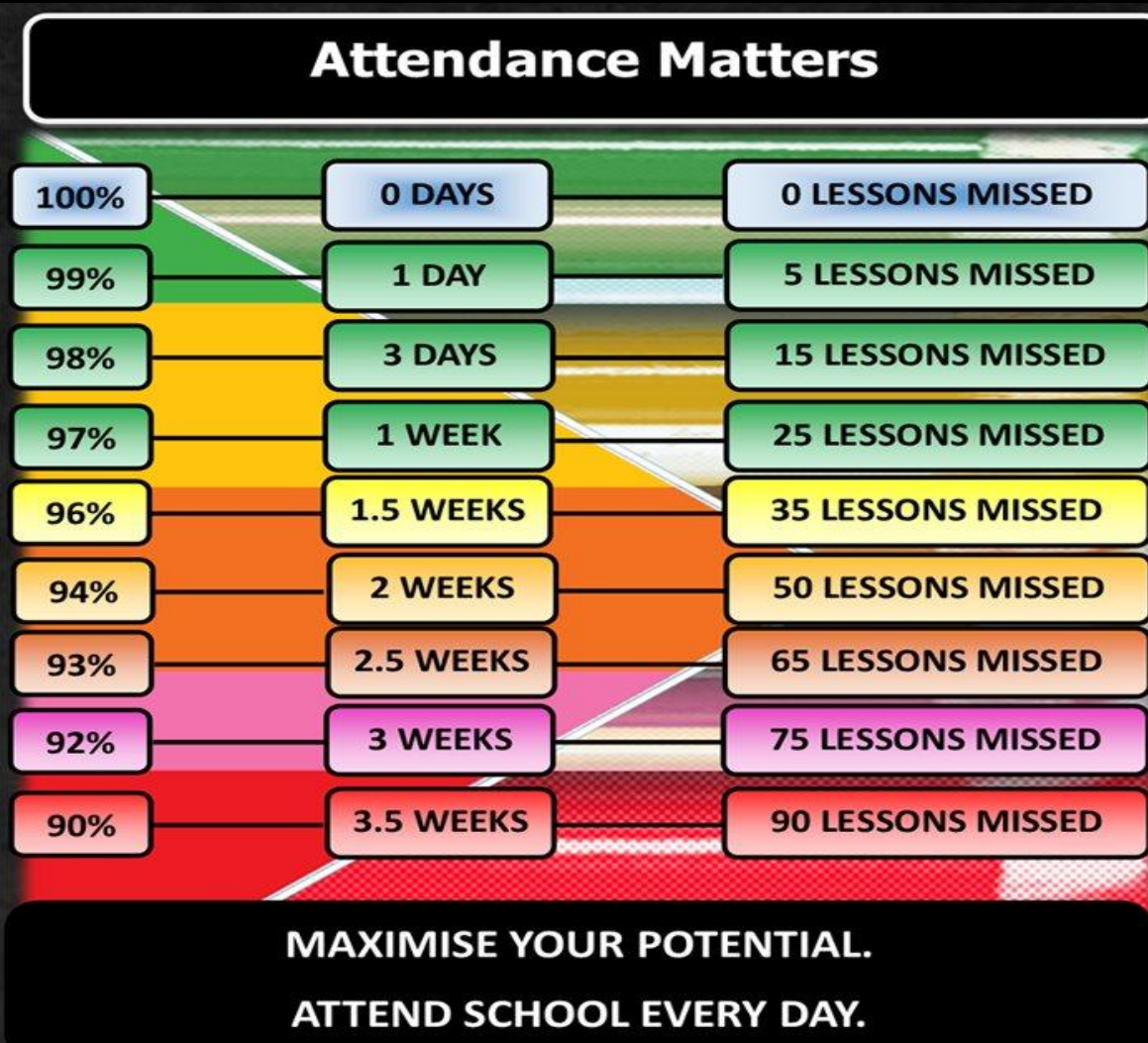

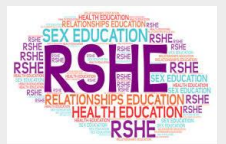

Tips for finding your placement

Do your research

Research using the internet or look on your high street for employers based nearby who might offer you a placement.

Don't be shy!

Emailing, telephoning and visiting employers in person. Research the company and find the name of the key person to ask for.

Word of mouth

Talk to friends, parents, family members and enquire if they can help out or support. Everyone knows someone!

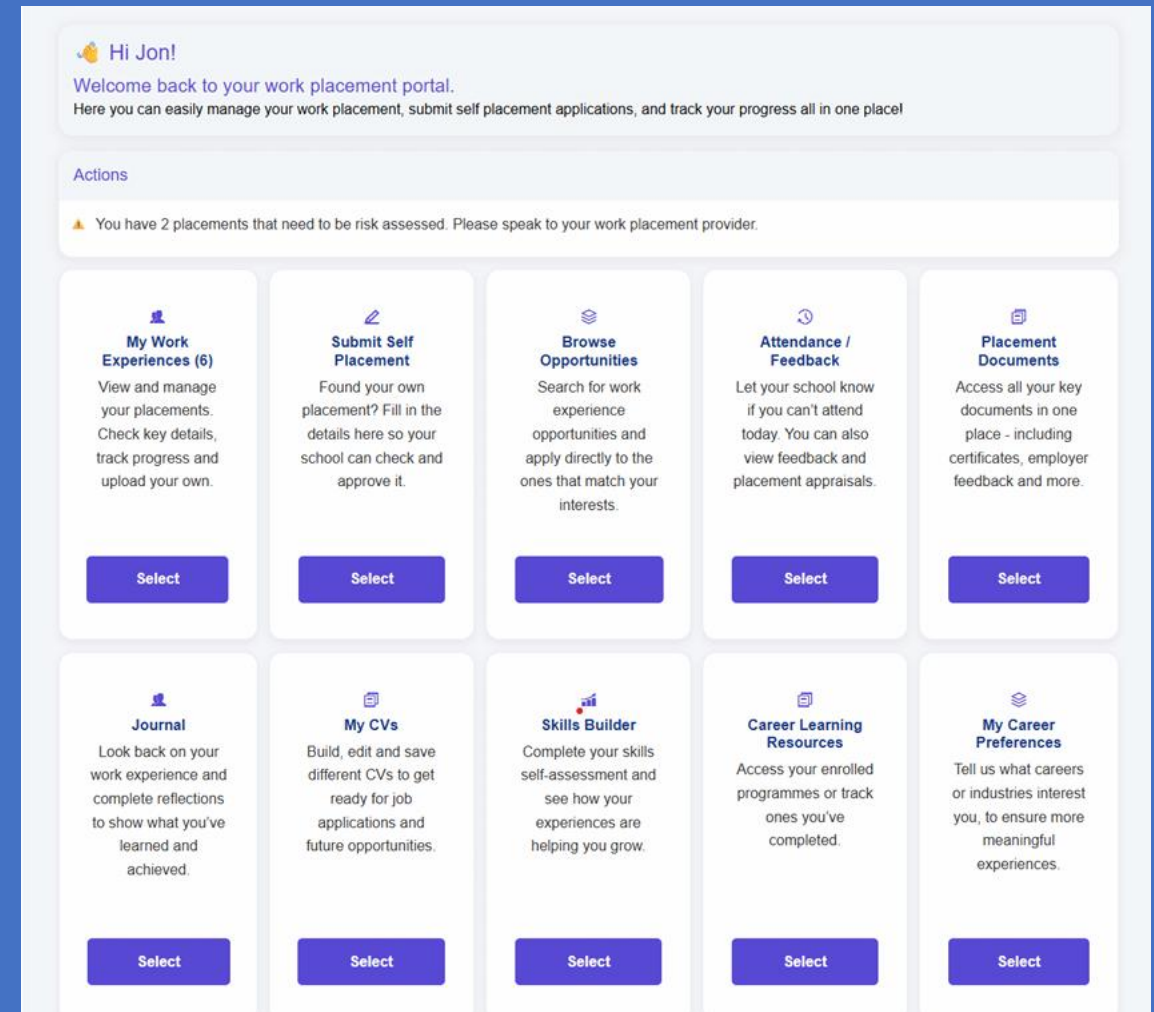

What do I do once I have found
my own placement?

Step 1: Access the Portal

You will be sent your portal link via your school email. This will take you to a page to log in, from there you can access your personal portal to add in your details.

Step 2: Skills Builder

Our new Skills Builder tool will allow you to develop and reflect on your skills as an individual.

This is a key part in preparing you for your work placement as this tool will give you building blocks to improve your listening, speaking, problem solving, team working and many more skills before your placement starts.

Step 3: Inputting your placement

Once you have found your own placement you will need to input the employer details into the portal so that we can help the employer complete the risk assessment process.

You will need to input your self-found placement using the portal at least 3 months before your placement start date.

I was able to gain a new sense of independence

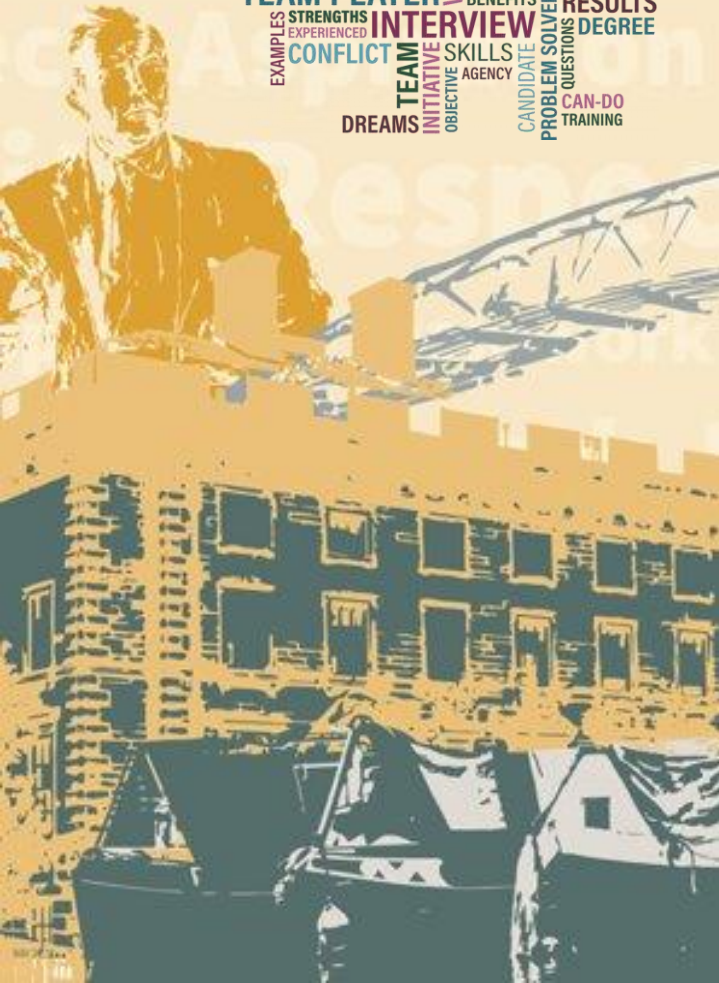
The entire experience and finding out what it is like to be a journalist was so interesting.

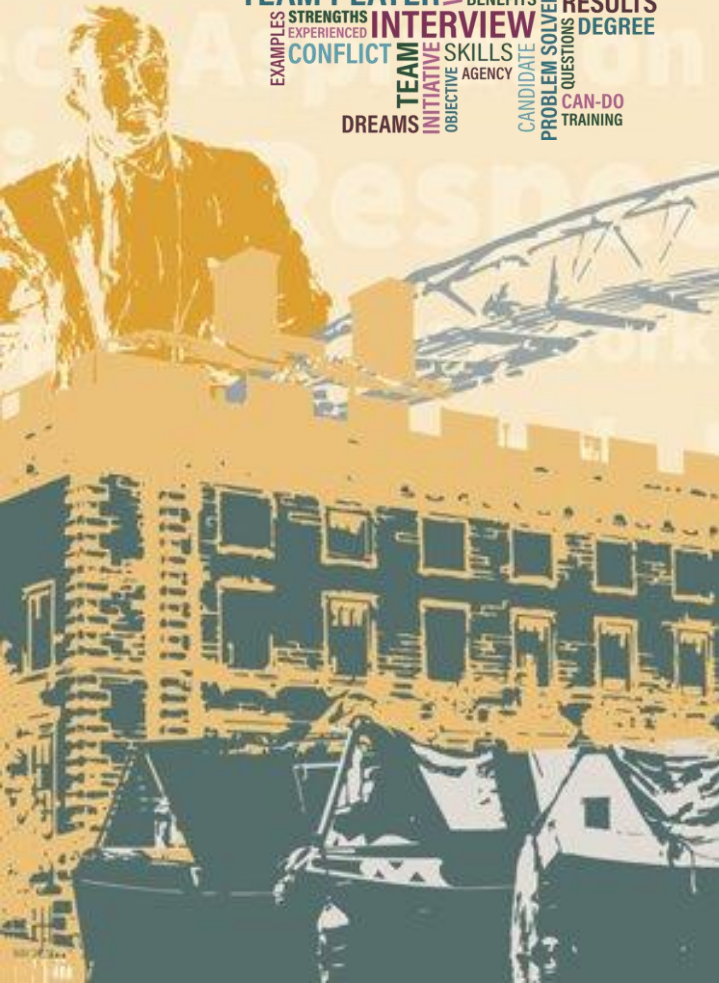

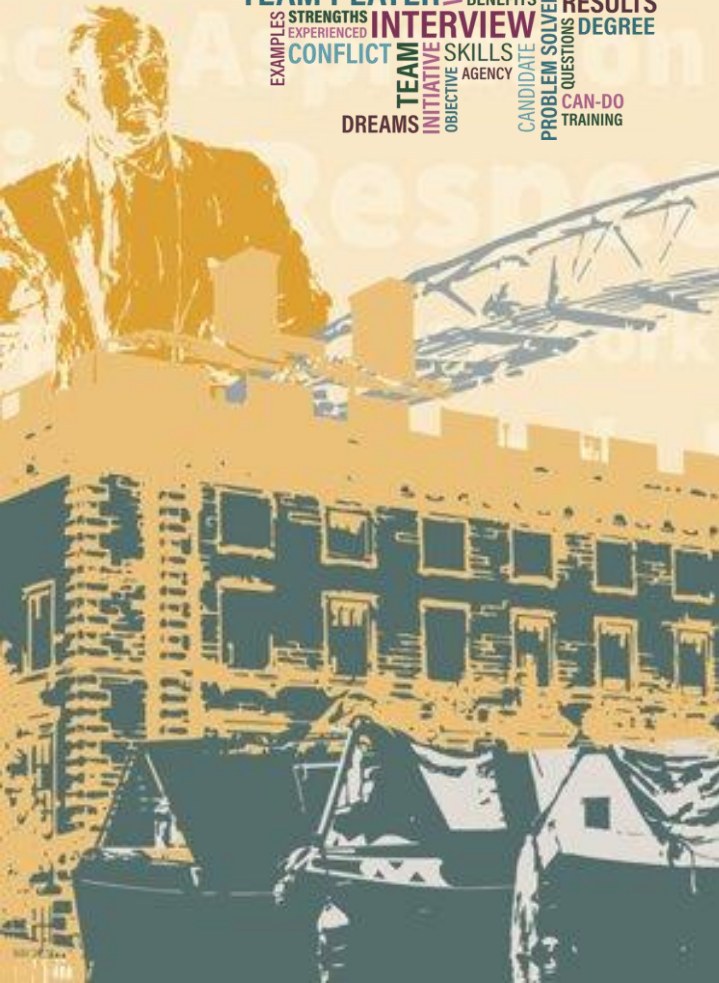

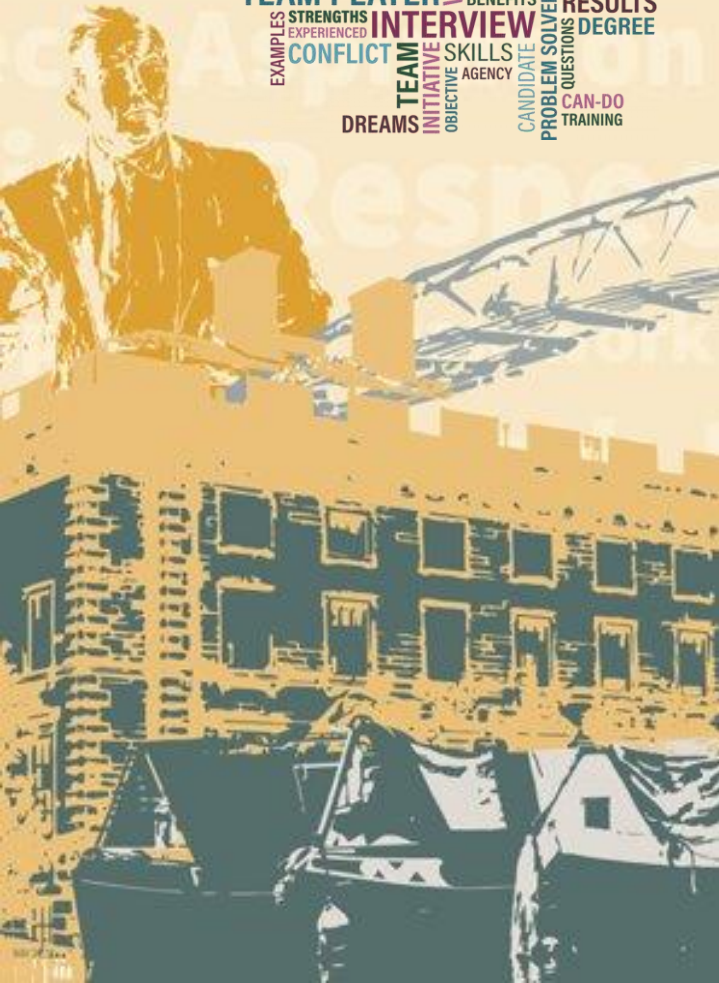

So, why are communication skills important when speaking to employers?

Being able to communicate effectively is an important employability skill. Communication has many different elements – it is all about:

- The words you say
- The way that you say them (your tone of voice)
- Your actions, gestures and facial expressions (this is known as your body language)
- Your ability to listen to other people

In order to communicate effectively in the workplace, you need to make sure that you are clear about the message you are putting across, what it means and what you are trying to achieve. Remember that you may communicate verbally (talking to others face-to-face or on the telephone), or in writing (via email, reports or letters). Good communication also involves listening to others and understanding the information they are giving to you.





Here are some of the ways in which you may already be developing and improving your communication skills:

- Writing assignments and reports as part of your school work
- Writing blogs or social media posts
- Giving presentations as part of your school work
- Speaking to teachers and other adults at school
- Being involved in a local group, club or team – for example, think about the importance of footballers being able to communicate clearly and positively with each other on the pitch
- Being aware of your posture (the way you hold your body and the gestures you make) and considering whether this gives a positive or negative message to others



Teamwork

In the workplace, you will need to be able work well alongside other people – for example, you may be working as part of a small team to complete an important project by a certain date; all of the people in the team must get along well and work together to get the job done on time (there is no time for arguments or disagreements!)

Working well in a team means working towards a shared goal or outcome, having your say but also being prepared to listen to other members of the team, taking everyone's ideas on board (not just following your own ideas) and sharing responsibility for the performance of the team.





Problem solving

Problem solving is all about finding solutions when you're faced with a challenging or difficult situation. People with good problem solving skills are able to think logically and figure out a way to resolve the issue.

Here are some of the ways in which you may already be developing and improving your problem solving skills:

- Carrying out research to help you complete your school work (such as writing assignments or reports)
- Talking about a problem with someone else and deciding on a solution together
- Talking to other people to find out how they tackled a particular problem
- Using the internet to find a solution to a problem (maybe finding a useful article or video tutorial)

Initiative

Showing initiative means that you are able to look for things that need to be done and then get on and do them without being asked. People with good initiative can also think creatively and come up with ideas for improving the way things are done.

Here are some of the ways in which you may already be developing and improving your initiative skills:

- Getting on with a productive activity in the classroom, without your teacher having to tell you what to do
- Making or proposing changes to improve the way a group you belong to does things
- Doing things around the house without being asked
- Finding an interesting or productive activity to do when you're feeling bored





Planning and organising

Being able to plan and organise things effectively is a valuable skill in the workplace – it means that you are able to work out what you need to do, and how you'll do it. Planning and organising also involves being able to set realistic timescales in order to meet deadlines.

Here are some of the ways in which you may already be developing and improving your planning and organising skills:

- Developing a study/homework timetable and sticking to it each week
- Managing your time so that you can fit in all of your school work, family time, socialising with friends, sports and hobbies
- Helping to organise an event – maybe a party, a family get-together or a trip with your friends

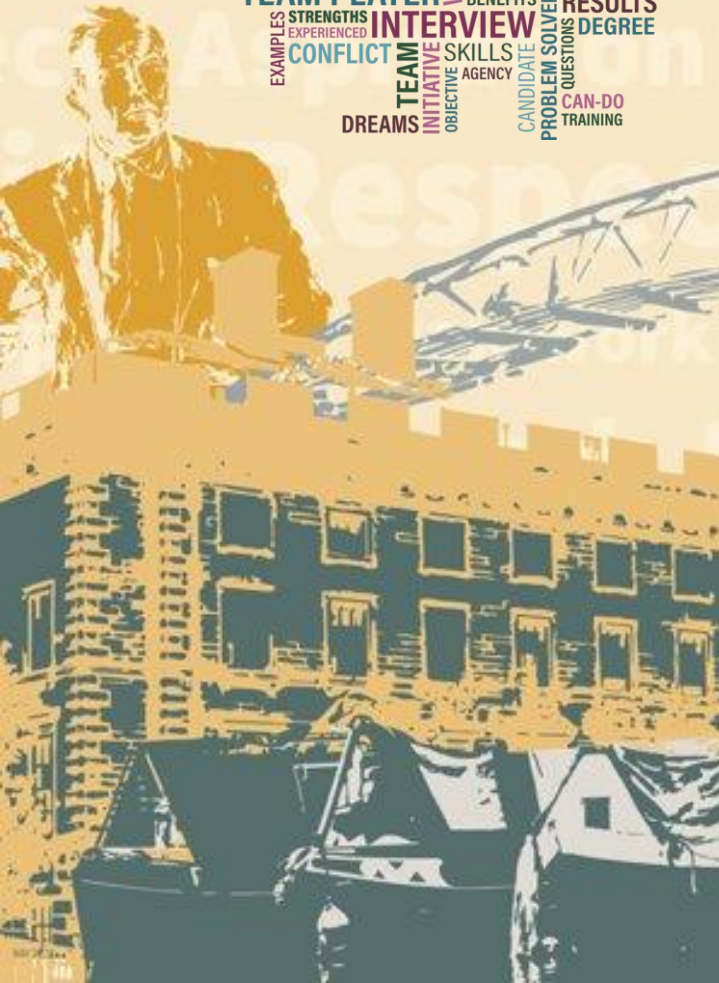
Learning

Being able to learn new things is a valuable skill, and you will use this skill throughout your life, particularly when you are at work. Being a good learner means that you want to know about new things, you are able to understand them quickly, you enjoy the challenge of taking on new tasks and you are comfortable dealing with change. These are all great skills in the workplace, as they will help you to develop valuable skills and be able to use them quickly and effectively.

Here are some of the ways in which you may already be developing and improving your learning skills:

- Listening and working well in your lessons at school
- Doing an online course (like this one!)
- Researching and learning new skills – for example, you could learn a new skill from a friend, a team coach or from an online video
- Starting a new hobby
- Joining a new sports team, group or club





Technology

Technology skills are all about being able to work well with technology – this can include:

- Being able to complete tasks using software such as word processing programs, spreadsheets, databases and email
- Knowing how to use office equipment, such as a photocopier
- Using social media
- Working with design, graphic or video editing software
- Knowing computer programming languages
- Knowing how to use hardware, such as a computer, laptop, camera or smartphone

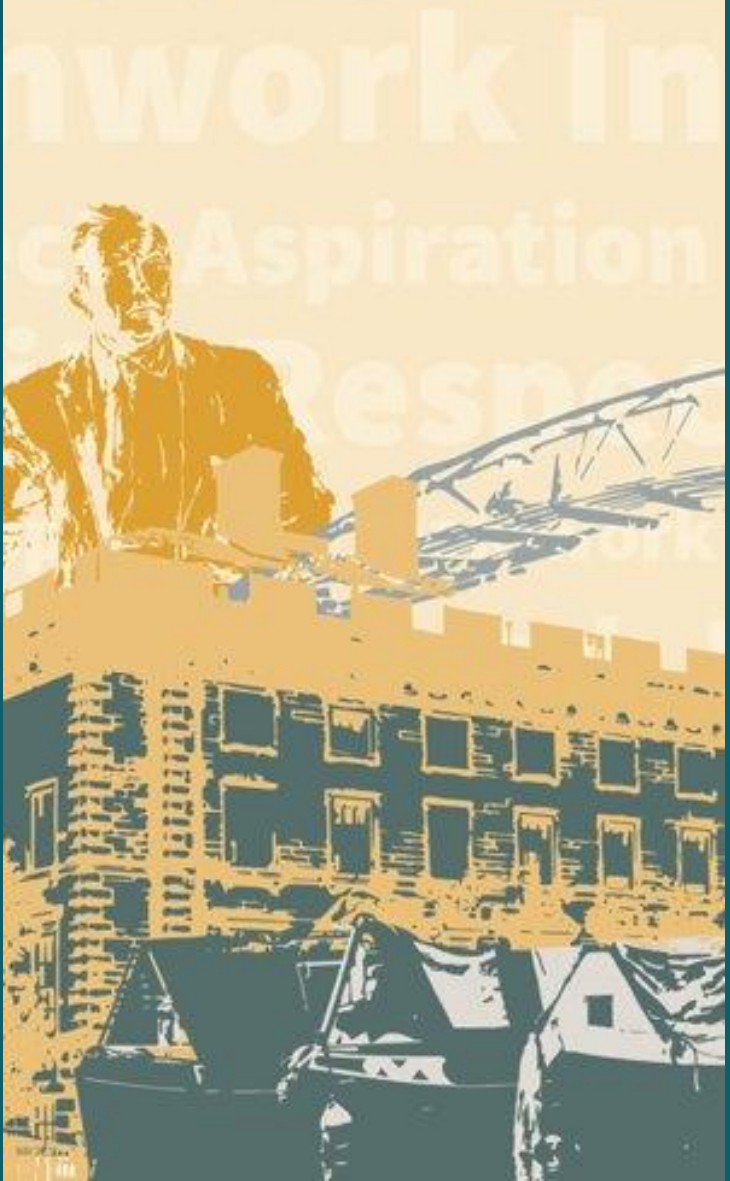
